Anywhere one looks, the army of volunteers is hard at work. They do almost anything: they sew, clean, paint, repair things, record books for the blind, amuse sick children in hospitals or escort old people who do not want to go out alone.

Some people volunteer out of boredom because they need to find an occupation outside their house or work. But the majority is prompted by the desire to be useful. There have always been such people ready to give of themselves unselfishly.

At the beginning of the American Civil War, around 1861, a school teacher named Clara Barton undertook to deliver to the wounded soldiers all sorts of supplies: clothes, food and even medicines that they could not get easily. She paid for <u>these</u> out of her own money at first and later from the funds that she could collect from other generous people. She also ventured on the battlefields, during or after the battles to help the wounded and the dying.

She helped later in other wars in Europe and attracted a number of women willing to share her work. The group grew and eventually became the American Red Cross which now counts about 1,360,000 volunteers with a budget of eighty two million dollars, all from voluntary contributions.

Another pioneer of the same period, Dorothea Dix, fought to enhance the living conditions in the 'hospitals' for the mentally-ill., which were not well run at the time. Her efforts finally caused state governments to take financial responsibility for these institutions.

The early volunteers deserve special respect and admiration, for they were working alone and doing hard and unpleasant tasks. Often, they were regarded by the authorities as trouble-makers rather than angels. The situation improved as <u>their</u> number grew and as society became aware of their achievements. Gradually, the volunteers began to receive funds from private sources and from the government. They organised themselves, they became professional, and they did a considerable amount of good work.
